Cooking Up Winter Squash

Do you know the difference between a summer and a winter squash? The third graders in Ms. Tobias' class could tell you. In partnership with Blue Watermelon, these students learned about the Blue Hubbard Squash and it's multiple benefits. Local Chef Jaron Bates shared his recipe for a roasted squash with a honey-sage gastrique for the students to try. In cooking for his restaurant, he forages his own ingredients and uses seasonal crops that support local farmers and ranchers. Bates, who is full-blooded Navajo, enjoys creating meals that represent Arizona cuisine and showcase indigenous ingredients. This activity was a perfect way to celebrate Native American Month and bring awareness to the Navajo people.



Hands-On Training

This year at Cheatham, Coach Billman created a boys group in partnership with the 6x6 brotherhood. This group was designed to provide a supportive space for students in grades 5th through 8th. The purpose is to empower young boys by providing them with the tools, confidence, and ambition to become successful men. This past week one topic they are working on is self sufficiency. The boys were given an opportunity to learn how to change a car tire with hands-on practice thanks to the help of Mr. Cuccia.
