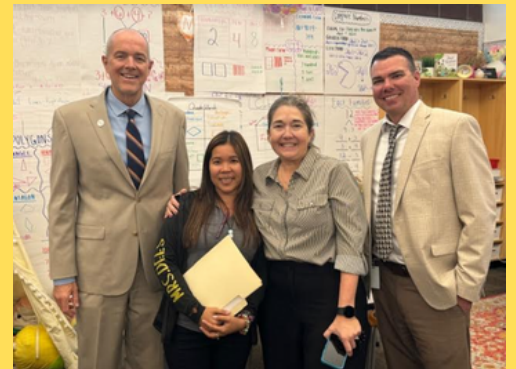
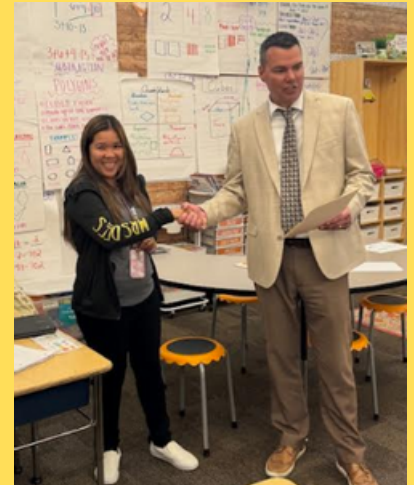
Cooking with Cabbage

Statewide Assessments show how well schools are teaching and how well students are learning. These assessments are aligned to Arizona's Academic Standards and are a time for students to show the amazing learning that has happened this year.

HOW CAN YOU SUPPORT?

- **Attendance and timeliness is important**
Testing will start first thing in the morning.
- **Testing is exhausting**
A good night's rest and breakfast will help students stay focused.
- **Encouragement is helpful**
Testing can make students anxious, reassure your child to do his/her best!
- **Make Appointments before or after school.**
Tests are not timed, but must be completed within the school day.
Students picked up early will not be able to finish a test they started.

WHAT DO THEY NEED?

All students will need headphones for these tests. While the school does provide them, students are permitted to bring their own. The headphones must be able to plug into the chromebook. Wireless OR bluetooth headphones are NOT permitted during any portion of the AASA, per the Arizona Department of Education guidelines.
